

This nobleman *m.* 6 Nov. 1795, Elizabeth, dau. of William-John, 5th Marquess of Lothian, by whom (who *d.* in 1822) he had no issue. His lordship, having conformed to the church of England, took his seat in the House of Lords. He *d.* 9 Dec 1826, when the honours devolved upon his kinsman, JOSEPH-THADDEUS, 11th baron, who was *b.* at Grau, in Hungary, 1 June, 1790, and *m.* 6 May, 1829, Elizabeth-Anne, eldest dau. of Sir Henry-Joseph Tichborne, Bart., and by her had issue,

DOUGLAS, SIR ROBERT-ANDREWS-MACKENZIE, of Glenbervie, co. Kincardine, *b.* 19 July, 1837; late a capt. 57th regt.; *s.* as 3rd baronet, at the decease of his father, 1 Nov. 1843.

Lineage.

THE HON. SIR ROBERT DOUGLAS, 2nd son of William, 9th Earl of Angus (*see* HAMILTON, D.), obtained from his father the lands of Glenbervie; which Sir Robert was *s.* at his decease by his eldest son,

WILLIAM DOUGLAS of Glenbervie, who was created one of the original *Baronets of Nova Scotia*, with a grant of 1600 acres of land in that colony, 30 May, 1625. Sir William *m.* Janet, dau. of Alexander Irvine, Esq. of Drum, and was *s.* at his decease by his only son,

SIR WILLIAM. This gentleman *m.* Anne, dau. and heir of James Douglas, of Stony-Path and Airdit, with whom he acquired an accession of property. He *d.* in the reign of CHARLES II., and was *s.* by his only son,

SIR ROBERT, a gen. officer in the army, and col. of the Scotch Royals, which he commanded at the battle of Steenkirk, in 1692, where he fell; and dying without male issue, the title devolved upon his cousin,

THE REV. SIR ROBERT DOUGLAS, D.D., and rector of Stepney. Sir Robert *d.* in 1750, and was *s.* by his eldest son,

SIR WILLIAM. This gentleman, who was a lawyer of great eminence and learning, was chosen, in the year 1726, provost

of the city of St. Andrews, and was annually re-elected for nineteen years. He *m.* Elizabeth, dau. of John Douglas, Esq. of Garvald, and *d.* without issue, in July, 1764, when the title devolved upon his brother,

SIR ROBERT (author of the *Peerage and Baronetage of Scotland*), who *m.* thrice, but had issue by his 2nd wife only, Margaret, eldest dau. of Sir James MacDonald, Bart. of MacDonald, namely,

- I. ALEXANDER, a physician of great eminence, who *s.* to the baronetcy of Nova Scotia; and *d. s. p.*
- I. Janet, *m.* to Kenneth, a younger son of Donald Mackenzie, Esq. of Kilcoy, co. Ross, by Elizabeth, his wife, dau. of John Mackenzie, of Highfield, and had issue,

I. SIR KENNETH MACKENZIE, a general in the army, was created a Baronet in 1831. He *m.* 18 Dec. 1804, Rachael, only child and heir of Robert Andrews, Esq. of Hythe, in Kent, and by her (who *d.* 24 Jan. 1847) had issue,

ROBERT-ANDREWS, 2nd baronet. Kenneth, lieutenant 68th regt.; *b.* 14 July, 1809; and *d.* at Ceylon, in 1830. Alexander-Douglas, an officer in the army, *b.* 22 Dec. 1811; *m.* Anne, dau. and co-heir of Joshua Rouse, Esq., and had issue. He *d.* 6 May, 1848. Edward, *b.* 14 March, 1815; *d. s. p.* 9 Nov. 1835. Lyndoch, late 97th regt., *b.* 28 Oct. 1818; *m.* 26 July, 1848, Laura-Susanna, youngest dau. of the late Lieut.-Gen. Sir Archibald Campbell, Bart., G.C.B.; and *d.* 15 May, 1859, leaving issue, Helen-Maria-Mackenzie, *m.* 1874, to Andrew-Mitchell Mackenzie, Esq.; Laura-Augusta-Mackenzie, *m.* 1878, Donald Mackenzie, Esq.; Jessie-Beatrice-Mackenzie, *m.* 25 Oct. 1873, to Rev. 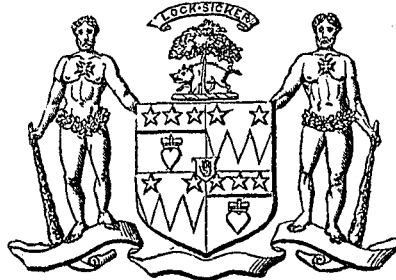

SIR HOWARD, G.C.B., G.C.M.G., K.C.S., and F.R.S.; a gen. in the army, and col. of the 15th foot; a distinguished officer of the Peninsular war; M.P. for Liverpool from 1842 to 1847; governor of New Brunswick, from 1823 to 1829; and lord-commissioner of the Ionian Isles from 1835 to 1840; D.C.L. Oxford; *b.* 1 July, 1776; *m.* in July, 1799, Anne, eldest dau. of James Dundas, Esq., a scion of the great northern house of Dundas of Dundas, and by her (who *d.* 22 Oct. 1854) had,

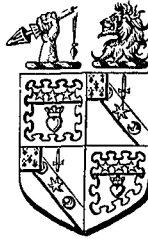

SCOTT-DOUGLAS, SIR GEORGE-HENRY, Bart., of Springwood Park, formerly Maxwell, co. Roxburgh, *b.* 19 June, 1825; late capt. 34th regt.; late M.P. for co. Roxburgh, lieut.-col. Border Rifle Volunteers; *s.* his father as 4th baronet, 23 Jan. 1836; *m.* 1 Nov. 1861, Mariquita-Juana-Petronila, eldest dau. of Don Francisco Sanchez Serrano de Piña, of Gibraltar, and has had issue,

Lineage.

This family is a branch of the ancient house of DOUGLAS of Cavers, hereditary sheriffs of Teviotdale.

WILLIAM DOUGLAS, 2nd son of Sir James Douglas, 5th Baron of Cavers, acquired the lands of Friarshaw, in the co. Roxburgh. He *m.* Eufame Davidson, and had by her four sons and one dau. He *d.* 1575, and was *s.* by his eldest son,

JOHN DOUGLAS, 2nd of Friarshaw, who *d.* without issue before the year 1603, and was *s.* by his brother,

GEORGE DOUGLAS, 3rd of Friarshaw, who *m.* Margaret, dau. of Hugh Myddilmeist, and dying 1623, was *s.* by his son,

ANDREW DOUGLAS, 4th of Friarshaw, who *d.* before 10 Jan. 1645, and was *s.* by his son,

ANDREW DOUGLAS, 5th of Friarshaw. He *m.* 1640, Jean Hume, of the family of Hume, of Polwarth. Andrew Douglas was *s.*, 1698, by his 2nd son,

HENRY DOUGLAS, 6th of Friarshaw. He *m.* 1672, Martha, only child of Samuel Lockhart, of Castlehill, youngest son of Sir James Lockhart, Knt. of Lee. Henry Douglas *d.* March, 1701, and was *s.* by eldest son,

GEORGE DOUGLAS, 7th of Friarshaw, who became a member of the Scottish bar, and held the office of Solicitor of Tythes, for Scotland; he *m.* 1702, Elizabeth, dau. of Sir Patrick Scott, Bart. of Ancrum, and was father of

I. SIR JAMES DOUGLAS, a naval officer of eminence, who was knighted, in consideration of bearing home the dispatch announcing the surrender of Quebec, in 1759; and was created a Baronet, 27 June, 1786, for his subsequent professional achievements. In 1761, he commanded a fleet at the Leeward Islands, took Dominica, and had a broad pendant at the siege of Martinique in the same year. Represented Orkney and Shetland for 14 years. Sir James *m.* 1st, in 1753, Helen, dau. of Thomas Brisbane, of Brisbane, and by that lady (who *d.* in 1766), had issue,

- ii. JAMES, Admiral of the Red; *b.* 3 June, 1755; *m.* 1st, in Nov. 1793, Elizabeth, dau. of Capt. Robert Scott, R.N., and widow of Capt.
