I desire that all my Just debts may be paid. Item, I give devise and bequeath to my Cousins John Dellafield, John Dell, Susannah Dell, and Mary Dell, each of them twenty five Pounds to be paid within three Months after my decease. Item, I give to my friend Basil Deme the Elder of Pater-Noster Row London Gentleman a Ring of the value of one Guinea. Item, all the rest and residue of my Estate whatsoever I give, devise and bequeath to my Cousin John Woodhouse of Bartholomew Close London, and my servant Mary Boyre to be equally divided betwixt them, share and share alike. And lastly, I do hereby appoint the said John Woodhouse and Mary Boyre Executor and Executrix of this my last Will. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty second day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and fifty four. *John Dell.* Signed sealed published and declared by the said Testator as and for his last Will and Testament in the presence of us who in his presence and at his request and in the presence of each other have subscribed our names as witnesses hereto. *A. *Richard Douglas* of Chipingwarden in County of Northampton Yeoman being weak in Body but of sound and perfect Mind

and Memory, praised be Almighty God for the same Do  
make and publish this my last will and Testament in manner  
and form following. First, I do commend my Soul unto God and  
my body to the Earth to be decently buried at the discretion of  
my Executor hereafter named and as for my worldly Estate as  
it hath pleased God to give me I do dispose thereof as  
followeth (that is to say) I give and bequeath unto my Sister  
Rebecca Boucham of Byfield in the County of Northampton  
widow the sum of five Pounds a year and every year for and  
during the term of her natural life and to be paid unto her  
by four Quarterly payments by my Executor hereafter named  
out of the Rents and Profits of my half yard land in Warmington  
field in the County of Warwick and my Quarter land lying in  
the fields of Edon in the County of Northampton aforesaid for  
and during the term of her natural life. I also do give  
and bequeath my aforesaid Salt yard land lying and being  
dispersed in the open and Common fields of Warmington  
aforesaid and my Quarter or fourth part of one yard land  
lying and being dispersed in the open and Common fields  
of Edon aforesaid with all and every of their Appurtenances  
therunto belonging unto my Spinwoman Susana Dumbleton  
Wife of Samuel Dumbleton of Byfield aforesaid Shepherds  
To hold to her the said Susana Dumbleton her heirs and  
assignes for ever. I also do give and bequeath unto my  
Spinwoman Josias Boucham of Byfield aforesaid Weaver,  
one Shilling. I also do give and bequeath to the poor  
Daylabouring Men of the Parish of Warmington aforesaid  
the value of one pound and one Shilling in Bread within  
one week after my decease. I also do give and bequeath to  
the poor Daylabouring men of the Parish of Edon  
aforesaid the value of one pound and one Shilling in  
Bread within one week after my decease. I also do give  
and bequeath unto my Tenant Simon Suggins of  
Warmington aforesaid one pound and one Shilling. I also  
do give and bequeath the use of all my Household Goods  
and Implements of Household of all sorts unto my  
Spinwoman Susana Dumbleton aforesaid for and during  
her natural life and from and after her decease I do give  
and bequeath my aforesaid Household goods and Implements  
of Household of all sorts unto her son John Dumbleton. And  
as to all the rest residue and remainder of my personal Estate,  
as Money, Goods and Chattels of what nature or kind soever,  
I give and bequeath the same unto my aforesaid Spinman  
Samuel Dumbleton, whom I here appoint sole Executor of  
this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all former  
wills by me made. In Witness whereof I have hereunto

year of our Lord Christ 1757 The mark of Richard Douglas.
